# Who or what is The Edge in Standardized Testing?

#### Why does the program start in the second semester?

Your child took a PSAT during the Fall of this year. Although his score did not count, it was a good representation of his raw ability as well as his future potential. So, during the Spring, using his past scores as a starting point, The Edge will prepare him for the PSAT that will be given during his junior year (which does count toward scholarships and college acceptances). Since there is not enough time in the Fall of next year to administer a full program before the actual test in October, the Spring of this year is the best time to begin the program.

## Does The Edge in Standardized Testing also offer individual tutoring?

Yes. The Edge offers individual as well as small group tutoring. Individual and small group tutoring will be scheduled based on the common availability of your child and one of the tutors. However, it is highly recommended that your child first take a classroom program. Then, afterwards, he can pursue individual or small group tutoring to focus specifically on his weaknesses.

# What is the difference between the freshman program and the sophomore program?

Since the most effective way to improve your score is to prepare continuously, The Edge has created a stepping-stone program. In freshman year, the program is based on creating a foundation of skills and strategies. In sophomore year, the program builds upon this foundation through extension and application of these skills and strategies. Thus, the two courses are not the same. Each program has separate and unique lesson plans, assignments and goals. However, the two programs work together to create a supreme test-taker who has not only learned the skills and strategies but mastered them through usage.

## Does the program help prepare them for other standardized tests?

Yes. The program prepares your child for the PSAT, SAT and ACT. The skills and strategies learned are relative to all standardized tests.

#### If my child didn't take the program as a Freshman, can he still take it as a Sophomore?

Yes. Although your child unfortunately may have missed the opportunity to learn the skills and strategies during his freshman year, it will be possible for him to catch up to those who did. The sophomore program begins with an extensive review of the skills and strategies learned during the previous year. Undoubtedly, those students who learned it slowly in a classroom setting will have an advantage at first. However, by paying close attention to the review, studying the notes and asking questions, your child will quickly be on par with the other students.

# What supplies do we need for the program?

Your child will need a notebook, pen/pencil and calculator. All other materials, including the packets of notes and booklets of practice problems, will be provided for them.

## What do I do if my child misses a class?
